

alien species are present, interesting native ones are also found, including the very uncommon woodland horsetail in one spring outflow, and seepy areas with fringed Polygala and nodding Trillium on their margins.



CONSERVATION LANDS

A number of properties are protected as conservation lands. The Pennsylvania Game Commission owns a 117 acre tract in District Township, which is used for wildlife conservation and recreation. The Pine Creek Valley Watershed Association owns a 44 acre parcel of mature woodland adjacent to the state gameland. Other privately owned land has been placed under conservation easements which protect natural features and limit or restrict uses not compatible with the conservation values of the site. This map shows the locations of these properties. A later section of this plan will describe private land protection options.
